## Is my project eligible?

#### **Projects must:**

- Prevent/reduce crime or anti-social behaviour or assist victims of crime
- Be delivered by young people, aged 25 and under, and involve them in the management

Projects may be proposed for an award by anyone, and endorsed by the High Sheriff of the county. You can find the contact details of your county's High Sheriff **here**.

Each will be invited to make a short presentation, introducing their work and describing what they have achieved.

They each receive a medal, and their organisation prize money, trophy and certificate.
